Homeowners can receive up to \$5,000 for exterior repairs, if they meet applicable guidelines, including but not limited to household income below \$65,000. Ms. Prager indicates applications will be received on a first come first serve basis and properties must be owner occupied. A brief discussion ensued about language in application to preclude residents from qualifying if they have any citations or judgements against. Ms. Prager explained the intent was if they owed the City outstanding fees. (Examples: Fire Service Fee or B&O taxes). She will clarify the language, as the money can be used to help residents currently in municipal court.
