The Northern Panhandle Continuum of Care (NPCoC) Ranking and Rating Committee for the FY2024 HUD CoC Competition has reviewed your Project Application. Each project was scored utilizing the NPCoC Ranking and Rating Tool. The Rating and Ranking Committee reviewed your application and your thoroughness in answering questions and understanding the priorities of the NPCoC, as well as your data and performance, from available data. Your project has been accepted and included in the FY2024 Priority listing for submission in the collaborative application. Your project is prioritized under Tier 2 Bonus Projects.

The CoC Rating and Ranking Committee ranked 134,244.00 for NPCoC Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) Project. The overall project score was 210. You ranked 1 out of 2 CoC Bonus project proposals. The NOFO regulated that Tier 1 funding must equal 90% of the CoC's total Annual Renewal Demand (ARD) Amount and 10% of the CoC's total ARD in Tier 2.
